### AP EUROPEAN HISTORY EXAM

- The exam is divided into a multiple-choice section dealing with concepts, major historical facts and personalities, and historical analysis and a writing section with a document-based essay designed to test students' ability to work with historical evidence and two thematic essays on topics of major significance.
- Approximately one-half of the questions deal with the period from 1450 AD to the French Revolution and Napoleonic era, and one-half deal with the period from the French Revolution and Napoleonic era to the present.
- No essay or multiple choice question will focus on the pre-1450 AD or post-2001 AD periods.
- The exam is 3 hours and 5 minutes in length.



- 80 multiple choice questions
  - Approximately 40 questions deal with the period from 1450 AD to the French Revolution and Napoleonic Era (1789-1815 AD).
  - Approximately 20 questions deal with the 19<sup>th</sup> century (1801-1900).
  - Approximately 20 questions deal with the 20<sup>th</sup> century and beyond (1901-2001).
  - Questions will be divided roughly equally between intellectual and cultural history, political and diplomatic history, and social and economic history.






  - Both essays together count as 55% of Section II score (or 27.5% of the overall exam score)





